

LIVING AS THE BODY OF CHRIST

Some of Saint Paul's best known and most beloved imagery is contained in the passages from First Corinthians that we have heard last week and this week: the many gifts granted by the one same Spirit and the many members making up the one Body of Christ. Few passages from sacred scripture more accurately sum up how Christian vocations work together.

Unlike some of Paul's other writings, which are a product of the social and religious conventions of his time, these enable us to look at our own lives and the lives of those around us to discern what gifts, what vocations the Holy Spirit has given for the good of all. We can likewise know the joys and sorrows of the other members of the Body and share in them for the strengthening of the whole Body of Christ.

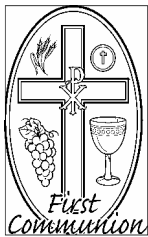

Dear Parishioners,

Through your generous and sustaining gifts over this past year, St. Vincent de Paul was able to bring the light of Jesus into the dark places of the poor. In 2006 our small staff of volunteers made over 450 home visits to our neighbors. We brought approximately 800 boxes/bags of groceries and helped 65 families with utilities. None of this would have been feasible without your prayers and financial help and that of our pastor and Cabrini staff.

Our members who make regular weekly home visits have dwindled to seven plus a few others who can fill in on occasion. The average age of those home visitors is 76 years! (This doesn't include one 45-year-old.)

Our mission is to increase our spirituality by bringing Christ into the lives of people we visit. It means giving them spiritual nourishment, feeling their pain, listening to their stories and bringing them food when they are hungry. Our work takes dedication, time, some physical strength, patience, sacrifice and love — our reward is a glimpse of Christ at the most unexpected moments.

We must have physically able people willing to give 4 hours/one day a week to St. Vincent de Paul to continue our work. Please pray for vocations to SVdP for yourselves and others. And, if you would like to know more about this ministry, please call Marylyn at 529-0022.
