

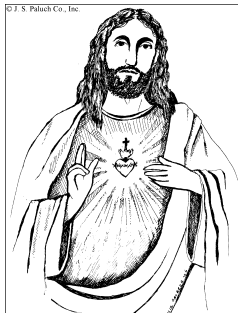

FEAR NOT

How do people find hope in the face of suffering and death? That is the question addressed by today's scriptures. We hear of the suffering of Jeremiah and the psalmist. REPORT FROM OUR PARISH ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY:

With love for your neighbors who have so little, look around your house to see what clothing, household items and furniture you no longer use — and give it to our St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Shops. Our thrift stores are receiving fewer donations these days; therefore, sales are down accordingly — so we need your help desperately!! Fr. Bob has given us the "OK" to have one of our SVdP trucks come to Cabrini on a Sunday morning to accept your donations. Hopefully, this will happen in July. Please start saving your clothing and small items and WATCH the bulletin for the date and times.

In the month of April, our members made 71 home visits and helped most of those families with food. Because of the extra help we are receiving from the SFC Parish Council, we were able to assist ten families with rent and six with utilities.

The price of groceries, utilities and gas has affected all of us; but think, for a moment, what it has done to the poorest among us. Apartment rents in our neighborhood average \$600+ per month, and utilities average over \$150. Groceries for a family of 4 run upwards of \$400 per month. Some landlords have installed less efficient window air-conditioners because they take less maintenance, but poor households cannot afford the excessive electric bills. Sun Tran reports that more and more people are riding buses (they cannot afford gas or cars). However, one client told me that she works until midnight at a fast food restaurant 7 miles from her home and the last bus pick-up is at 9:50 p.m. She worries about being fired if she can't work her schedule.

We St. Vincent de Paul members cannot fix everything; but, because we work within a parish like ours, we are able to really make a difference some of the time. Thank you and God bless you for your prayers, your support, and the trust you place in our Society.
